The collaborative and interactive components of this program aim to encourage multicultural understanding, leverage knowledge on SDGs and nurture leadership.</p>

■評価基準と評価方法 Assessment Criteria and Methods					
Assessment Criteria:					
1. Student displays ability to explain the 17 SDGs and the significance behind them (Objectives 1, 2)					
2. Ability to conduct collaborative research on topics related to SDGs (Objectives 1, 2, 3, 4)					
3. Ability to collaboratively prepare and conduct a visual and oral presentation on a specific issue at hand (Objective 4,6,7)					
4. Ability to explain in one’s own words the diverse forms of global leadership (Objective 5)					
5. Ability to practice and exercise leadership skills through collaborative work (Objective 6)					
Assessment Methods:					
30% Class activity and completion of assignments as required of students by each program lecture (Criteria 1, 2, 4)					
20% Collaborative group-based learning that include identification of specific SDGs-related issues and discussions for problem resolution (Criteria 2, 3, 4, 6)					
50% Interim group presentation on SDGs problem resolution, final group presentation and final written assignment (Criteria 2, 3, 4, 5)					

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■履修条件 Admission Requirements

- (1) Students must familiarize themselves with the objectives and purpose of the program and attend and/or complete all program components as stated.
- (2) Students must display keen interest in learning about the Pacific Island region as well as in active communication and interaction with their fellow program participants.
- (3) Students must be able to receive and follow instructions of program coordinators and lecturers to ensure smooth operation of the program.
- (4) Students must participate in all program components including pre and post programs. Students who are unable to do so due to unavoidable circumstances such as health issues or lack of adequate digital infrastructure must receive instructions from program coordinators on alternative learning. A failure to do so may result in the inability to receive credits for this class.

■事前学習・事後学習 Pre and Post Program Learning

(Pre-Program)

Prior to the main program, participants are required to participate in a pre-program COIL session (required time: 2 hours).

(Post-Program)

All participants must complete all program assignments and components by the required submission times (required time: 2 hours).

Those who successfully complete the whole program (including pre-and post-program components) will receive TWO credits for the University's "Special Lectures on Inter-Disciplinary Sciences". (These credits may be transferred upon review and approval of participants' home institutions.) All participants must take the BEVI* assessment thrice over the duration of program participation and report their assessment outcomes to the program coordinator.

* The Beliefs, Events, and Values Inventory (BEVI) is an online survey tool widely used for assessment of educational programs.
